## **ELC Title 1 Parent Involvement Policy**

   Parents are welcome to visit our school. Their support and assistance enhance learning and strengthens the family, school, and community partnership.
- Parents are full partners in the decisions that affect children and families:
   Parents and staff have a joint responsibility to share in the education of our children.
   Parents are included in decision making at district and school level through meetings and surveys.
- Community resources are made available to strengthen school programs, family
  practices, and student learning:
  The Partner in Education program, which involves the community businesses and
  organizations, is active in supporting our school (Kiwanis Terrific Kid, United Way
  Volunteers for Reading are two examples).
